A Letter from Our Team




Dear Friends,

In 2012, we taught our very first garden lesson at University Place Elementary school. Ten years later, our Gardens 2 Schools program has grown incredibly! We've shared our gardens with tens of thousands of students, hundreds of classroom teachers, and an **incalculable** number of bees, bugs, and butterflies! While the past decade has seen changes to our personnel, our goals, and even our name, we've remained committed to the same mission: to grow our **community** through food and education.

When we reflect back upon 2022, so much stands out! We taught **4,450 students** over the course of **1,505 garden lessons**. We harvested over 350 lbs of produce, including sugar snap peas, strawberries, sweet potatoes, and collard greens. We used much of that produce to make garden veggie dip, green smoothies, sweet potato hash, and braised greens with our students. On one particularly momentous day in September we found almost every life cycle stage of gulf fritillary butterflies at the Tuscaloosa Magnet School, including caterpillars, chrysalises, and butterflies!

We had some really amazing moments in 2022 and many favorite events. We participated in Tuscaloosa City Schools's **Summer Learning Program** and loved the opportunity to experience a new season in the garden, which was overflowing with **blackberries**, **carrots**, **and flowers**. In April, we partnered with the University of Alabama's Nutritional Anthropology Department to host a Family Food Event at Woodland Forrest Elementary. Students and



their families joined us on a beautiful Saturday morning to learn some garden-inspired recipes. We had a wonderful time **connecting over food** and cooking. Our time together deepened the students' engagement in noticeable ways the next time they came outside with their classes!

2022 was a year of change and growth for our organization. At the beginning of the year, we introduced a **new Garden Educator**, Leah Stern. During the summer, we were joined by our **new Program Director**, Sandie Champion, who has nearly three decades of teaching experience in TCS, where she loved bringing her 4th grade students to the Verner garden to work with Schoolyard Roots. These exciting additions to our staff have made us an **even stronger organization** and will help us to realize our vision for our programming. After a decade of teaching, we've learned much and are ready to apply our knowledge to creating the best programming we can for the next decade. We have much to look forward to in the years to come, but we're most excited to witness again and again that sight we **truly love:** students in our gardens with **dirt on their hands**, **smiles on their faces**, and **wonder in their eyes.**






